

## ● Financial Support Policies

SUNY Korea is committed to recognizing and rewarding our students' excellence in all areas of learning and research. We offer a variety of scholarships to new and continuing students, some of which are based on merit alone and others which take into account special talents, leadership and community service or financial need.

### [Admission Requirement]

1. Application form (online)
2. One (1) Official High School transcript
3. Letter(s) of recommendation
4. A TOEFL score of 80 or higher in IBT or 6.5 or higher in IELTS
5. SAT or ACT (optional)
6. Supplemental documentation: Upon request
7. Visa (Non-Korean Students)

To be considered for a full scholarship, students must meet the following requirements in addition to the admission requirements.

1. Top 5% in high school GPA
2. A combined \*SAT score of 1,350 or higher in the Verbal Reasoning and Quantitative Reasoning sections
3. Supplemental Application Form: To be provided on the SUNY Korea website

Once selected as a scholarship recipient, the student must maintain a GPA of 3.2 or higher in order to continue receiving the scholarship in the subsequent year.

### Which application do I use to apply?

You are strongly encouraged to apply online using the SUNY Online Application. please read all instructions on the Application Procedures webpage

### What if I already applied using the SUNY Application?

Do not fill out a new SUNY Online Application or pay an additional fee! The application fee is not refundable, so do not pay it twice. We will use the information received on the SUNY application, however you will be asked to complete a Missing Data Form to provide additional information that is not asked on the SUNY application. You must also complete all financial verification paperwork noted on the Application Procedures webpage. Do not send SUNY Financial forms (FSA 2, 3, 4); we cannot accept these forms for admission or to issue an I-20.

## 1. Apply Online

## 2. Send Your Academic Credentials

- English Proficiency: An official score report for the TOEFL, SAT, or IELTS. Stony Brook's code is 2548
- Academic Records:

All academic credentials must have an official seal, stamp or signature of a school or government official, and be submitted in the original language (if not in English, it must be accompanied by an exactly worded and certified translation)

### Already studying in the US?

The following items will be needed after you have been offered admission to Stony Brook.

- International Student Transfer Report, complete the top applicant portion and have the bottom portion completed by your Designated School Official
- F-1: photocopies of all Form I-20's (pages 1 & 3 of SEVIS I-20's, pages 3 & 4 pre-SEVIS I-20's)
- J-1: a photocopy of DS-2019
- Photocopy of both sides of current Form I-94 (stapled in your passport upon arrival in the U.S.)
- Photocopy of passport pages with your identification photo (both U.S. visa page & home country page)

## ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

Stony Brook is a selective institution. We will give your application individual attention, weighing many factors to gauge your potential to succeed at Stony Brook.

### Application Types

You should apply as an **international freshman** if you have never attended a college or university after finishing high school. You should apply as an **international transfer student** if you have attended any college or university after high school (in your home country or in the US)

### Academic Criteria

If you are a **freshman applicant**, you must have completed the highest level of secondary education in your country of residence. We look for a strong secondary academic program with courses in math, natural sciences, and English (or, if English is the language of instruction, another language)

If you have attended any college or university after graduating from secondary school you must apply as a **transfer student**. Applicants are required to have performed well in a strong academic program, having

completed at least 24 credits with a GPA of 3.0 or higher by the time they submit their application. If the applicant has earned fewer than 24 credits, high school transcripts must also be submitted

**English Proficiency**

All applicants must prove their English proficiency. The TOEFL (Test Of English as a Foreign Language), IB TOEFL (Internet-based TOEFL), or IELTS International English Language Testing System) examination, or SAT must be taken by anyone whose native language is not English, even if you have attended high school in the United States. If you are a transfer student and have not completed a college-level writing course at a U.S. college or university (or received a grade below a C in the course), one of the aforementioned exams is required for you as well.

**Financial Documentation**

It is also necessary to provide financial documentation which indicates that the applicant has sufficient funding to pay for all educational and personal expenses while in the United States. The amount considered as sufficient funding may vary from year to year.



---

**Do I have to take the TOEFL exam?**

All applicants must prove their English proficiency. The TOEFL (Test Of English as a Foreign Language) examination must be taken by anyone whose native language is not English, even if you have attended high school in the United States. Transfer students who have completed a college level writing course at a U.S. college or university and have received a grade C or better DO NOT have to take the TOEFL exam. ESL courses DO NOT meet this requirement.

We require a minimum composite score of 213 (computer-based) or 550 (paper-based) on the TOEFL exam or a minimum SAT Critical Reading score of 430. For the IB TOEFL, we require a minimum score of 80, and for the IELTS, a score of 6.5 or higher is required. Satisfactory completion of Stony Brook's Intensive English Center program at the advanced level with a grade of B or better will be accepted in place of a TOEFL score.

**Do I need to send official transcripts and do they have to be translated?**

Complete and official academic transcripts are required for all secondary and post-secondary institutions you have attended. Failure to provide academic transcripts of all previous academic studies can be viewed as misrepresentation of your background and could jeopardize your application. If your transcripts are not in English, they must be accompanied by an exactly worded and certified translation.

You must list every college/university that you have attended on your application and submit all transcripts before you can be accepted to Stony Brook University. Students who do not notify us that they have attended a college or university will not be able to transfer those credits when the semester begins.

**Can I apply for conditional admission?**

No, applicants may not apply for conditional admission. An applicant, however, may be offered admission with conditions stipulated.

---

**When is the application deadline for international students?**

The application deadline for fall (September) admission is January 15. The application deadline for spring (January) admission is October 31.

---

**Does Stony Brook offer financial aid to international students?**

Stony Brook offers a limited number of scholarships to international freshmen. International students must be self-supported and must prove the ability to cover expenses for their entire period of study.

---

**Where will I be living if I attend Stony Brook?**

It is assumed that all international students require on-campus housing unless documented evidence of alternate living arrangements is filed with the application.

---

**How do I get my I-20?**

Your Form I-20 (Certificate of Eligibility for Non-immigrant F-1 Student Status) will not be issued until you have been admitted to Stony Brook University and have paid the required tuition deposit. Students already attending a school in the U.S. (high school or college) must be released from SEVIS by their advisor and submit the International Transfer Report.

**What are the requirements for admission?**

**Do I have to take the SAT exam?**

The SAT examination is not required for international students who have attended high school/college outside of the United States, but is required for international students who have attended high school within the United States. International students wishing to be considered for Merit Scholarships are required to have taken the SAT exam.

## Major in Technological Systems Management

### Overview

The Department of Technology and Society offers the major in technological systems management leading to the Bachelor of Science degree. The program integrates a foundation in the natural sciences, engineering, applied sciences, or environmental studies with applications in technology systems, assessment, and management. The department also offers a minor in technological systems management.

The department's focus is on technological advances that shape every facet of modern life. Students develop understanding of the characteristics, capabilities, and limitations of current and emerging technologies. Successful practices in government, industry, education, and personal life depend on such understanding. The department applies engineering concepts that underlie technological change and that form the bridge from engineering to other disciplines. In this multidisciplinary approach, the department provides one of the vehicles by which Stony Brook interacts with other universities and colleges, pre-college institutions, professional schools, government, and industry. Effective management of modern technologies requires use of tools from many domains: science and engineering, information technologies, economics, legal and regulatory practice, psychology and sociology, design and assessment. The major prepares students for careers in government, industry, or education – in positions such as quality control specialist, systems or environmental analyst, technical sales representative, or technology trainer/educator – in short, all professions and business ventures that are dependent on technological applications and implementation and in which project management is key to success. Students are also prepared for advanced study in such areas as business, law, education, policy analysis, and industrial or environmental management.
